A high level of corruption can have tremendous impacts on a country wellbeing because corruption can detain a country's global growth and poverty reduction. Several Indices like the Worldwide Governance Indicator, International Country Risk Guide, Corruption Perception Index or the Global Corruption Barometer are trying to measure the phenomenon of corruption. However, the reliability and the validity of the indices are debatable.

Therefore, we are looking for scientific contributions which can add scientific value to the current knowledge that relates to corruption and shadow economy.

Papers covering other related issues are also welcomed.
